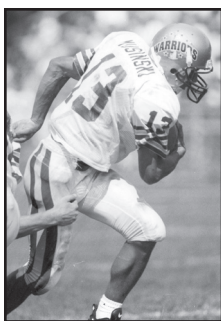


# Rich Musinski



You might get an argument on behalf of Sickler, Harris or Pizano, but a damn good case could be made for Rich Musinski as the Warriors best all-time football player. He is the only one of them who can be mentioned in the same sentence with Jerry Rice.

As junior at WA for the Warriors in 1997 Richie was an all-conference defensive back.

As a senior wide receiver he caught 64 passes for 1,032 yards and 10 touchdowns and scored five rushing touchdowns and another by punt return.

He had 11 catches for 126 yards in a come-from-behind win over Montrose in the District 2 2A championship game and nine for 120 in a loss to Montrose in the Eastern quarterfinal.

Rich went to William & Mary on a ride and set the Tribe's all-time marks in receptions (224), receiving yards (4,168), receiving touchdowns (31), 100-yard receiving games (21) and yards per reception (18.6). He is one of just three players in Division I-AA history to record more than 4,000 receiving yards, joining Florida A&M's Jacquay Nunnally and Miss Valley State's Jerry Rice.

Musinski was signed by the Tennessee Titans on April 26, 2004. He played in three preseason games for the Titans in 2004 and was released in the final preseason roster cuts on Sept. 5, 2004.

Same deal for New England where he was released in the last cuts after catching a touchdown pass from Matt Cassel in a Monday night preseason game.

Rich played two seasons for the Berlin Thunder in NFL Europe and two with the Pioneers in af2.
