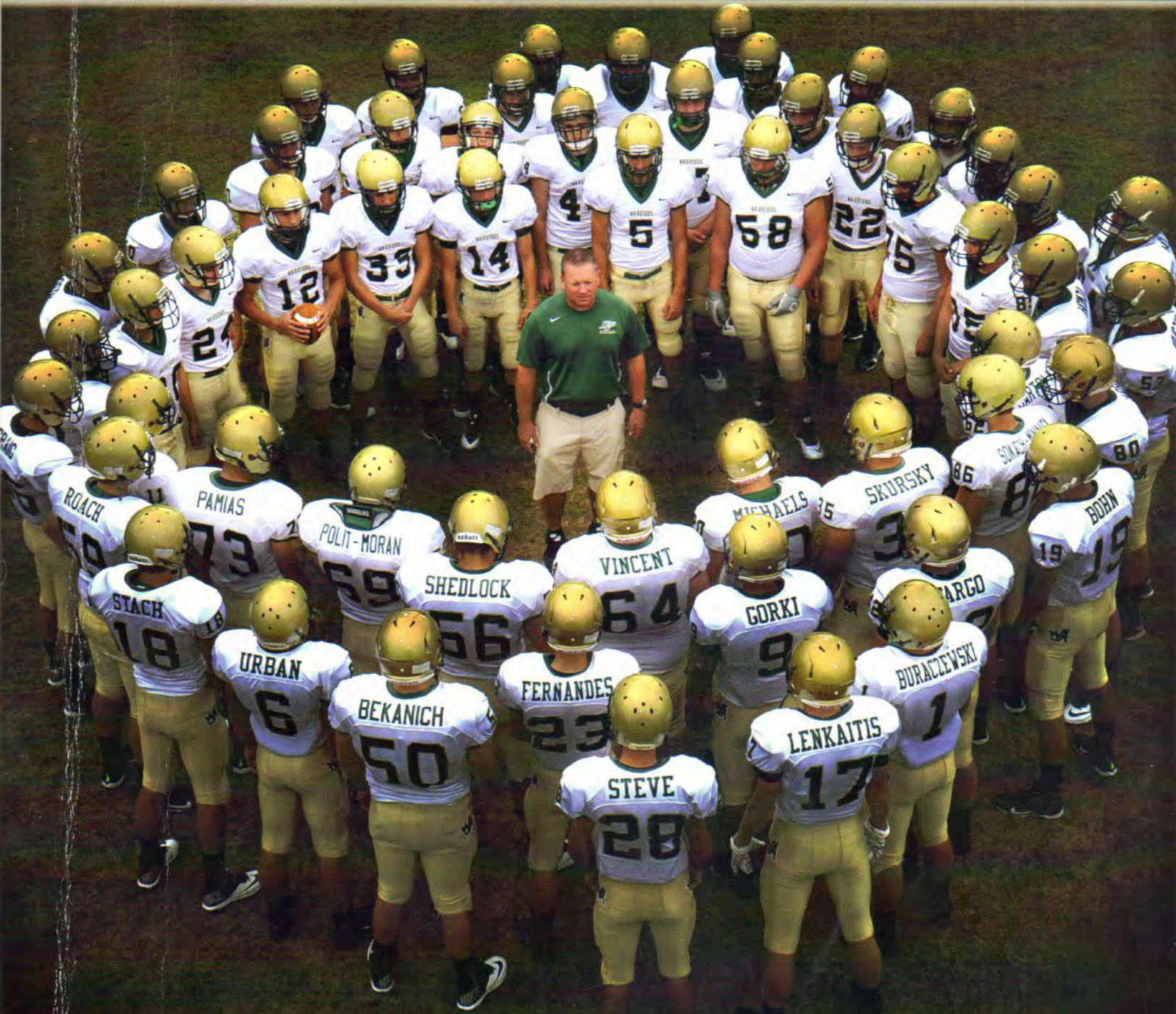


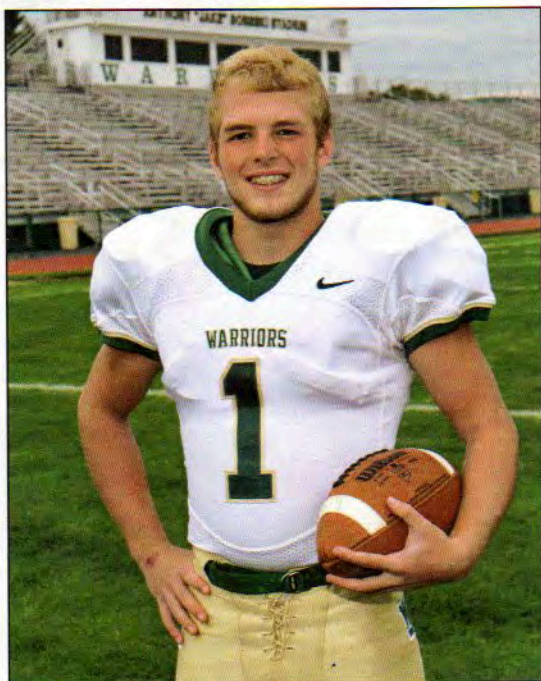

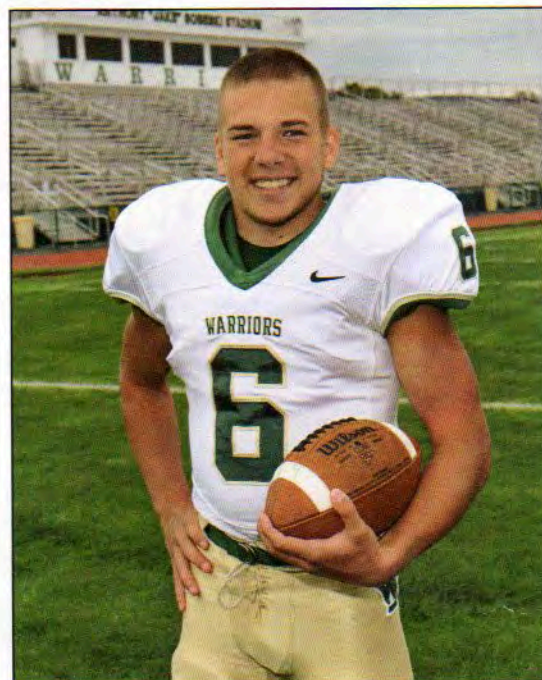
friendships and strong bonds he's made with his teammates. When asked about his favorite memory as a player, he says he doesn't have one. "The best is yet to come," he says with confidence.

A louie bootleg pass left." His least favorite football drill is thuds because, he says, "They give me headaches." He loves when Coach Spencer yells, "Bring it in!"

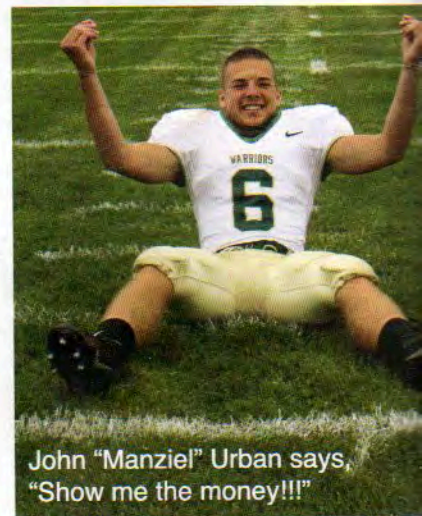
After graduation, Billy plans on attending college and majoring in business.

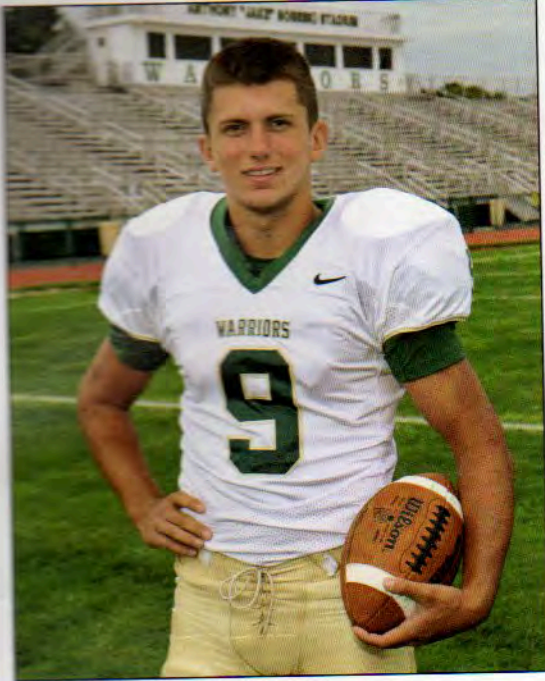

Like his teammates, John enjoys the friendships he'd developed with teammates. "We're like a big family," he says.

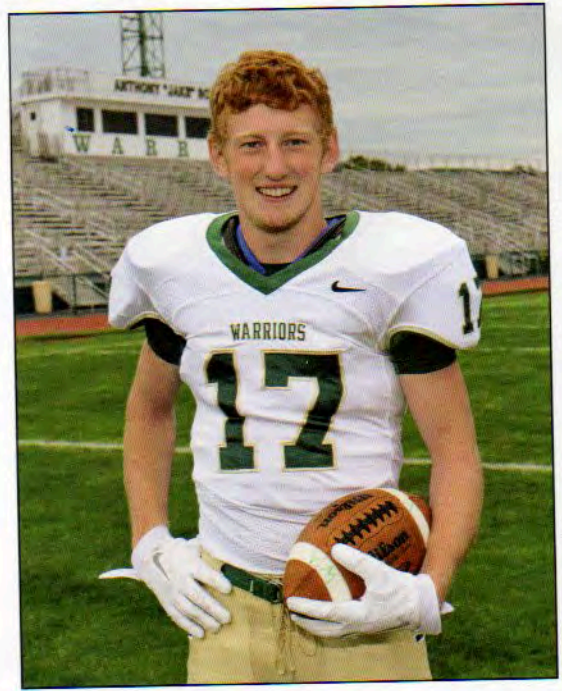


John "Manziel" Urban says, "Show me the money!!!"

After graduation, John plans to attend college become a physical therapist.



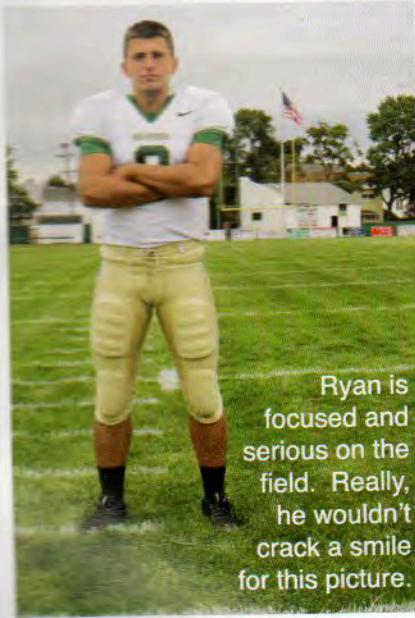

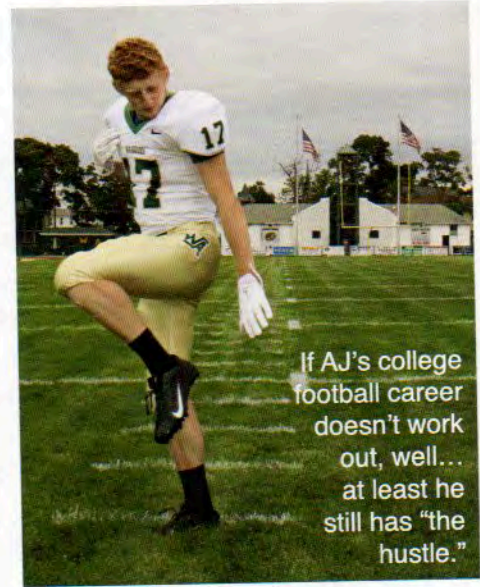

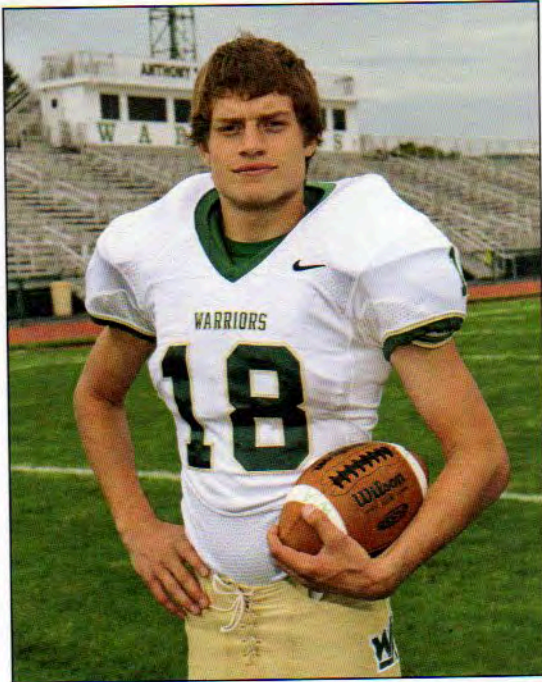
AJ's favorite memory was the first extra point he kicked as a varsity player.

AJ plans to attend college after graduation and pursue the rest of his football career.

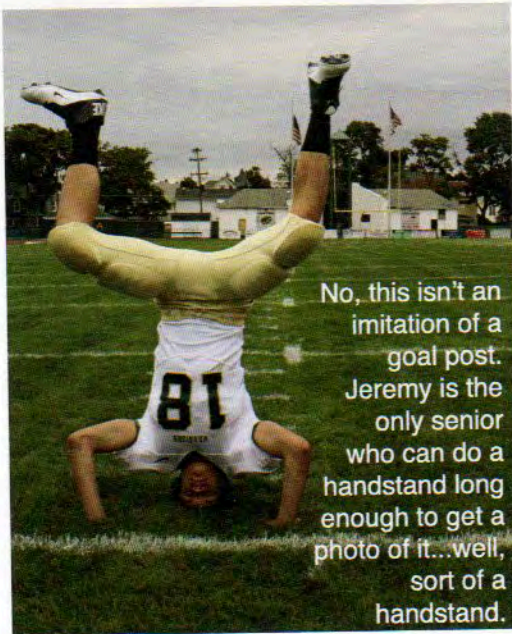


18 • Jeremy Stach - WR

Matt's favorite play is 44 a cross, but he doesn't like gassers. The most memorable thing he's heard a coach say? "You're SAWFT!"



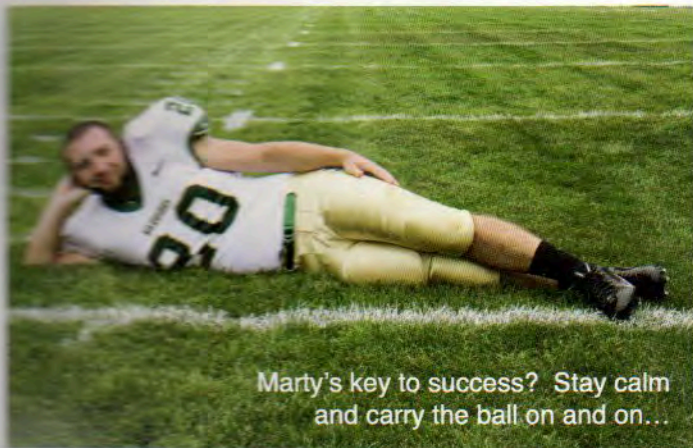
Matt's key to success? Focus on eliminating that mental "SAWFTNESS."

Marty's fondest football memory is his first touchdown. He says that his favorite play is the fullback trap and he loves to hear the coaches say, "Good job, Marty. Good play."

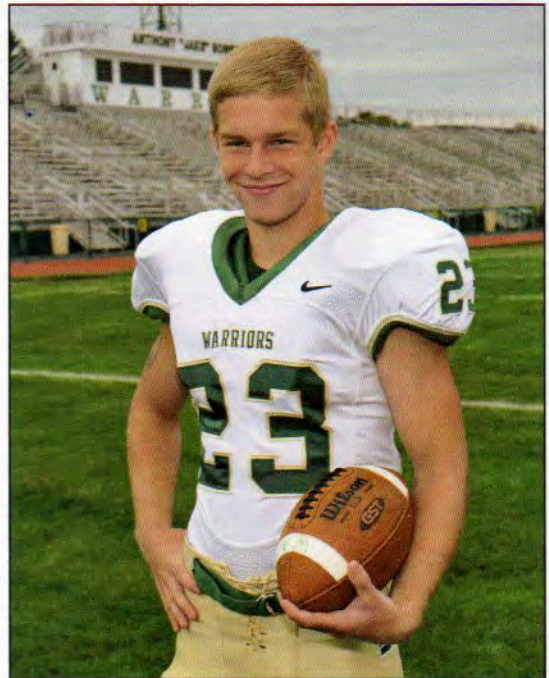


Marty's key to success? Stay calm and carry the ball on and on...

After graduation, Marty plans to become a fire fighter.

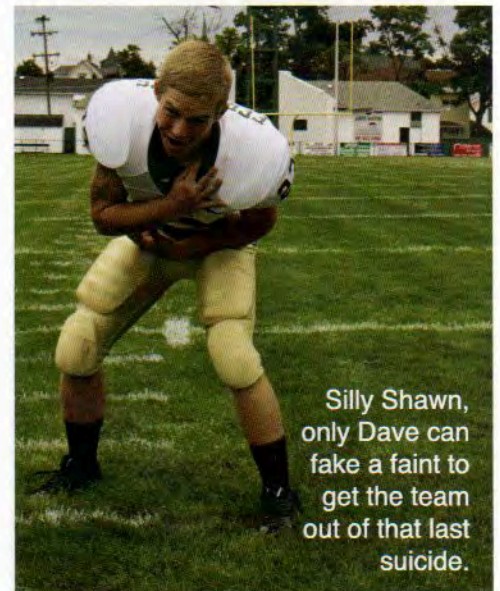

23 • Shawn Fernandes- RB

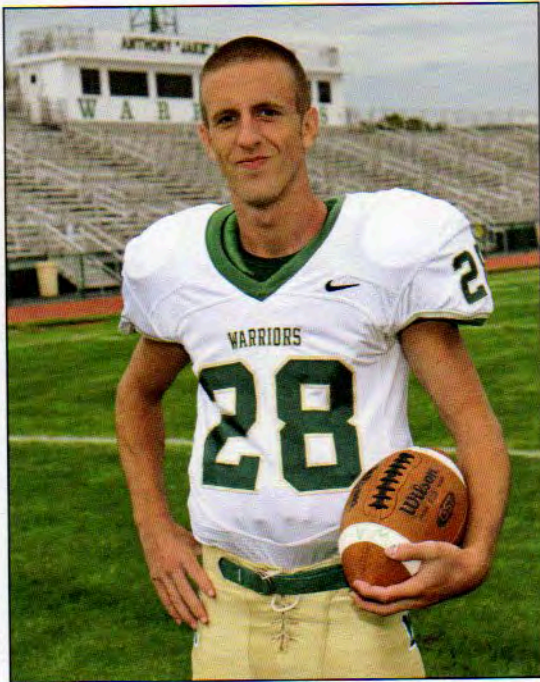

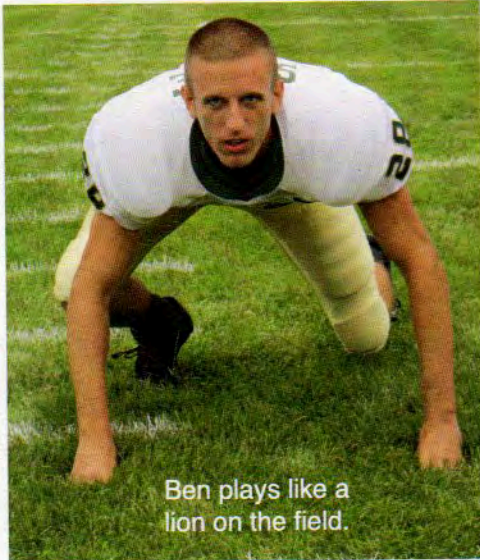
Silly Shawn, only Dave can fake a faint to get the team out of that last suicide.

Ben Steve likes everything about the Warrior football program. "We are outstanding. The players, the coaches, and everyone involved gives the program 100%." Ben's favorite play is



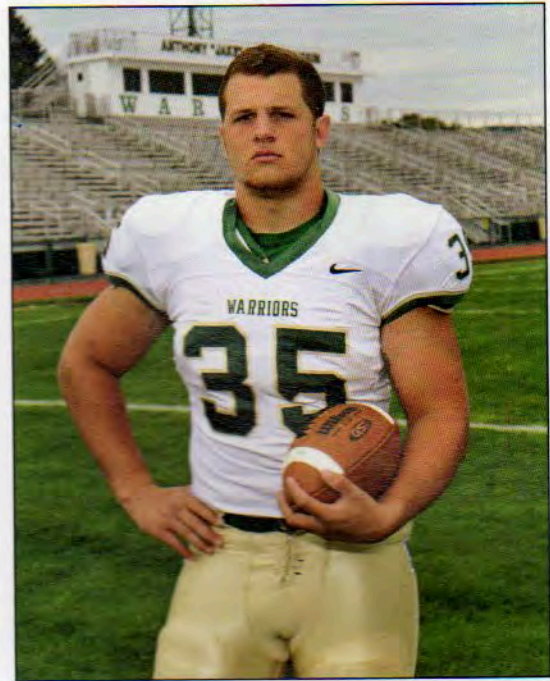
Ben plays like a lion on the field.

What Jeff likes most about the Wyoming Area football program are the friendships he's developed with teammates. "We're all a family," he says.

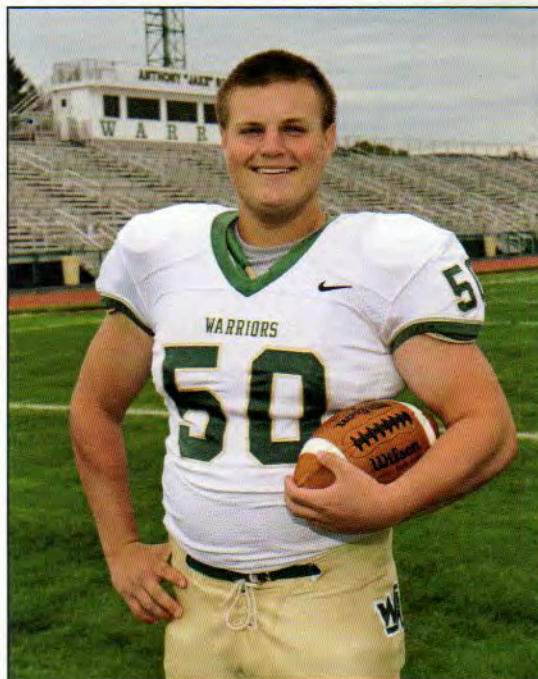
Jeff plans to attend college after graduation and continue his football career.

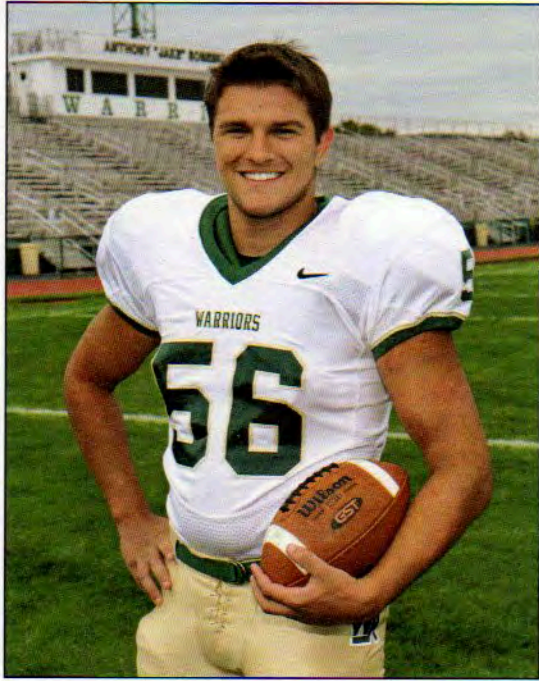
The best thing he's heard in the film room? "Okay, see you guys tomorrow." And his least favorite football drill? "Hitting the sleds," he says.



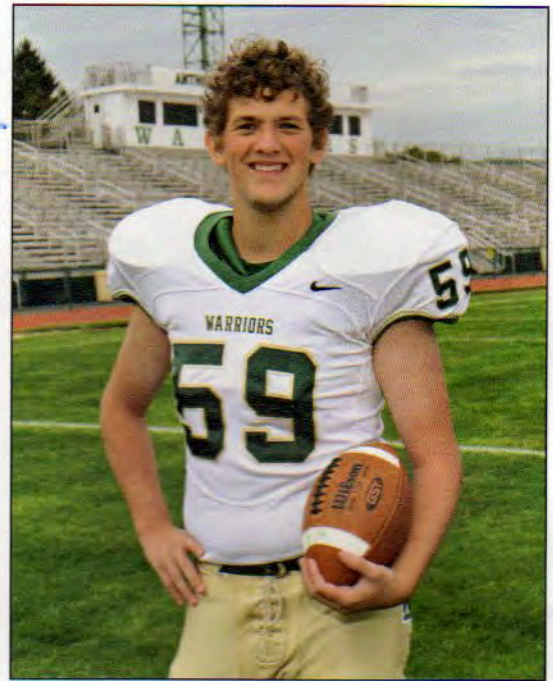

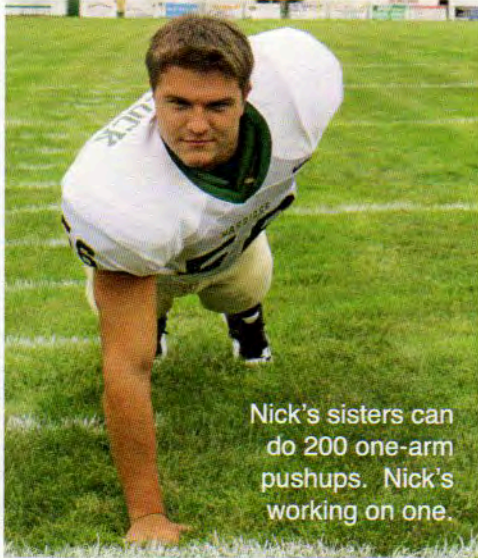

When asked what he likes most about the Wyoming Area football program, Dave is short and to the point, "That's easy. Everything." Dave says his fondest



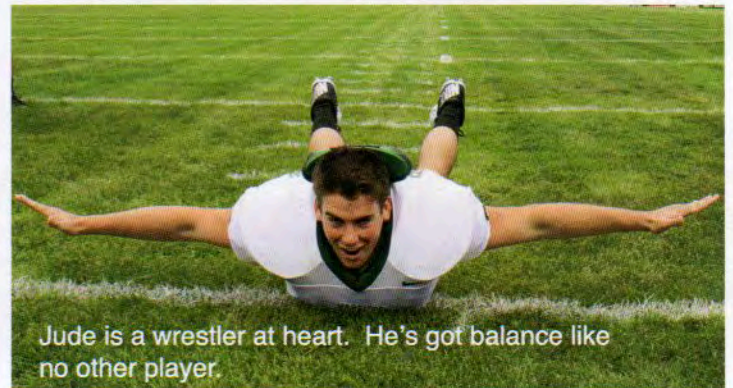
memory as a player is the practice during which he and Nick Shedlock beat up on each other. Dave hates the rake drill. "It hurts my head," he says.

After graduation, Dave plans to have lots of fun.

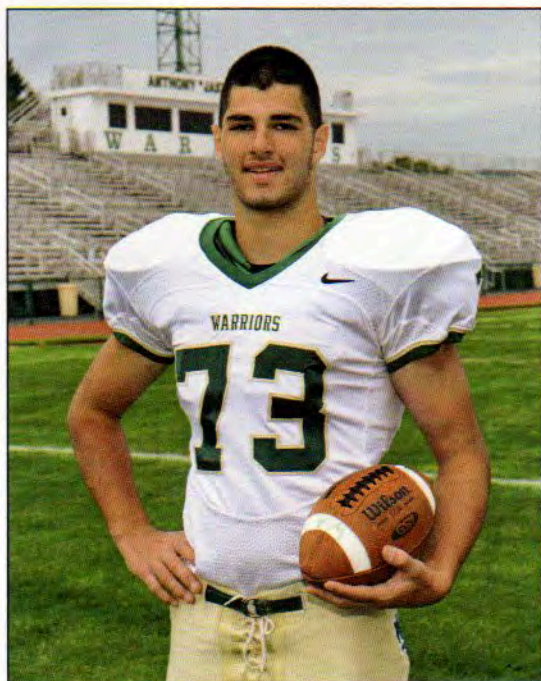
Jude's favorite memory as a Wyoming Area football player happened this year during double sessions. "Big Dave dropped over after two gassers!"

After graduation, Jude plans to attend college and become a family physician.



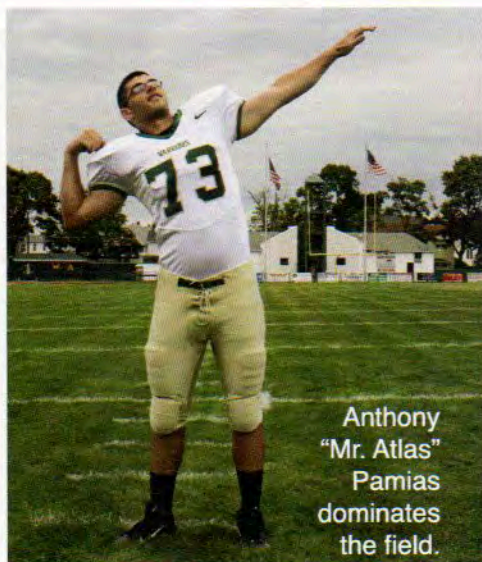
73 • Anthony Pamias - T

Anthony plans to attend college after graduation and continue his athletic career.



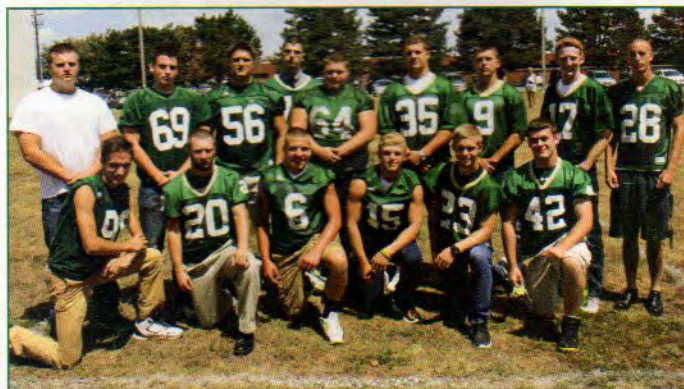

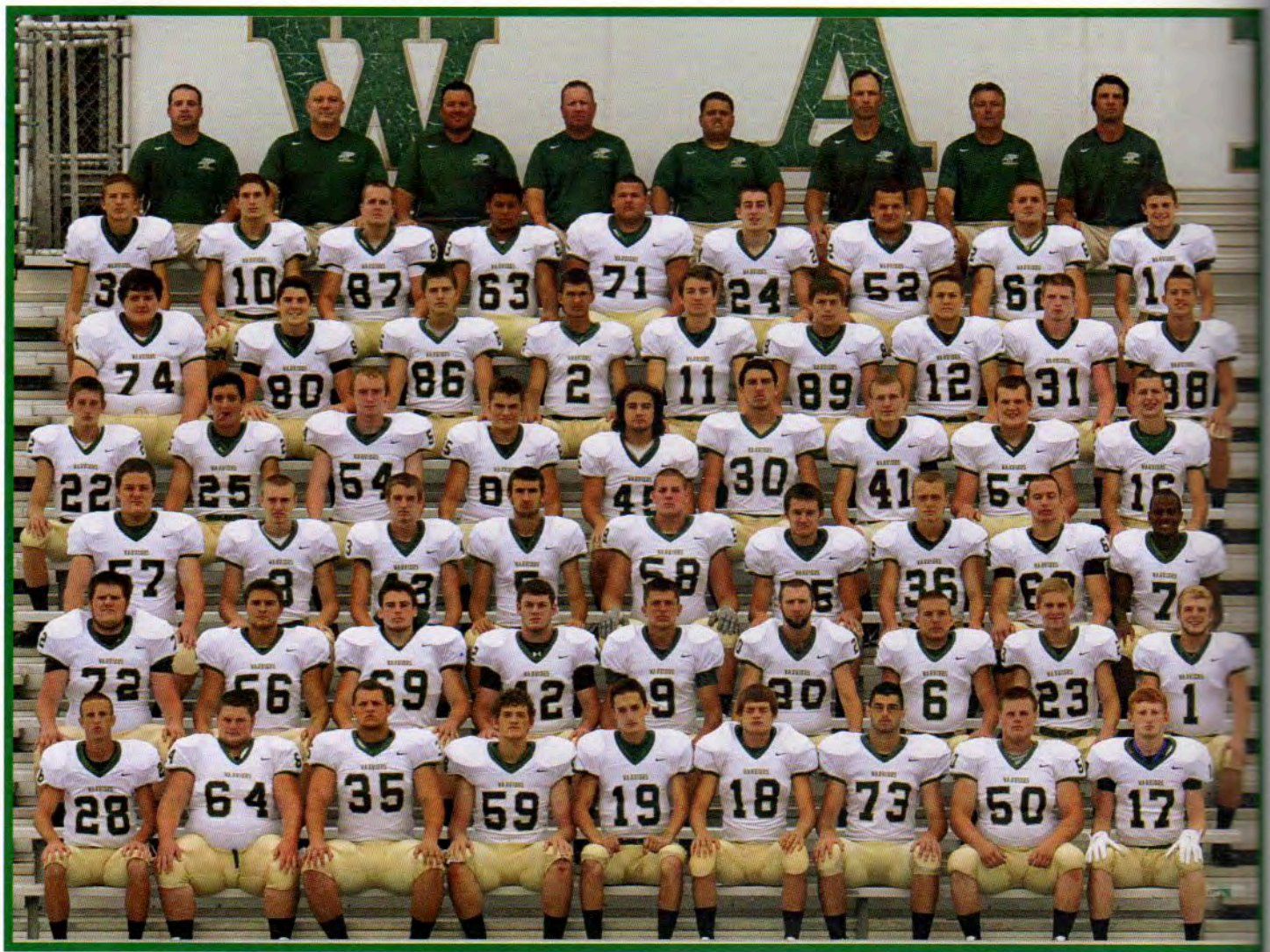
